## Mosterton Pre-School

This year has been a busy year for the pre-school. In January, we were awarded a Capital Funding Grant towards building our own preschool on the site of Parrett & Axe Primary School. This will allow us to offer the Government's pledge of 30 hours of free childcare from September 2017. At the moment, we have a shortfall in funding. We have applied for grants and also a Public Works Board Loan, all of which are

currently pending with outcomes in the very near future. At a recent meeting of Mosterton Parish Council, the parishioners voted in favour of the Council applying for a loan on behalf of the Pre-school Committee, which we, the Pre-school, will repay in full as agreed. In the meantime, we are continuing to fundraise and thinking of new ideas to involve our local communities. We recently hosted our bi-annual Jumble Sale, our annual Oathill Tea Rooms Egg Hunt and also our first ever Village Easter Egg Hunt. All were well supported and the money raised will go towards much needed resources, including the new building. Thank you for your support; Hopefully, we will have some even more exciting news in the very near future! ### **Parrett & Axe Parish Council**

Below is a summary of some of the topics discussed at the Annual General and Ordinary meetings of the Parish Council held on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> May 2017. A full set of the minutes from both meetings are available on the Parish website ([www.parrettandaxe.org.uk](http://www.parrettandaxe.org.uk)) or from the Clerk when accepted at the next meeting/s. In addition to the Parish Councillors and Clerk, also in attendance were District Cllrs Tony Alford and Peter Barrowcliff, Footpaths Officer Dominie de la Poer and River Warden Martyn Gillingham. Apologies were received from Cllr. Liz Fray, Cllr. Jane Cooper, Dave McSkelly and Bob Buckland (Tree Warden).

#### **Annual General Meeting-**

- ❖ **Election of Officers** – Kate Organ was re-elected as Chairman. The election of Vice Chairman was deferred to the next meeting.
- ❖ **The Chairman's Report 2016/17** highlighted the following: - **Planning** with the aim that all new building and alterations should enhance and not be detrimental to the environment; **Highways – Lecher Lane/A3066 junction** is still an issue; The welcome return of the **Coach & Horses Inn**, which has reopened after refurbishment; Broken **Fingerposts in South Perrott** are being repaired by Mike Charles; **Picket Lane Railings** – following the renewal of the first section attention is now focused on the second section from Parrett Mead to Court Barn Cottage. An application to the Lottery Heritage Fund is being considered. **Mobile Phone reception** is still erratic. It should improve in 2019 when EE takes over all the “not-spots”.
- ❖ **Footpaths Officer's Report** - There are 10 footpaths and 3 bridleways in South Perrott. This year there have just been minor issues, such as overgrown vegetation, fallen branches and muddy patches. These have been dealt with by landowners and local residents. Following a suggestion from the Parish Council, a simplified map of rights of way in South Perrott and Chedington has been produced (*reported under the Ordinary Meeting*). **Many thanks to Dominie who, after 10 years as Footpaths Officer, is retiring. - ❖ **River Warden's Report** - Martyn Gillingham reported that the winter of 2016/17 had been comparatively mild and dry, and there had been no major issues with flooding in the village. On one occasion in November 2016, the A356 had flooded at New Bridge between South Perrott and the Misterton crossroads and became impassable to cars and light vehicles. Once notified Martyn cleared the gullies of autumn leaves on both sides of the road so that the flood water was able to drain into Lecher Water.
- ❖ **Finance** – the new financial year began with £5,782.73 in the Parish Council's account.

**Ordinary Meeting** – this immediately followed the AGM

#### ❖ **Reports from District Councillors and Police Officer**

- **District Councillor Tony Alford** reported on the Local Government Review – the application has been made to the Secretary of State but the informal decision on the proposals for the new unitary authorities has been delayed by the local and general elections.
- **Police Report** – there was no formal report but all the parish councillors now receive regular Dorset Alert messages.
- ❖ **Matters Arising from South Perrott Annual Village Meeting held on 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2017**
  - **Village clean-up** – to be held this year on Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> July. *See separate item.*
  - **Broadband** – it was noted that fibre has been available in the village for a year. Some who have signed up were still receiving a variable service. Those who had not signed up were experiencing a worse signal than before.
  - **Millennium Green** – the play equipment is to be removed as it is beyond economic repair. The Trustees are still looking for an organisation to take on responsibility for the Green.

- **NORDCAT Bus Service** – This is providing an excellent service for those who use it. There are two buses, one on Wednesdays to Dorchester and one on Fridays to Yeovil. (*We have been informed by a regular user that the Dorchester service may be withdrawn unless they have a minimum of 6 regular users*). The ring and ride number is on the back page.
- **Local residents** have reported nuisances caused by daytime bonfires, dog fouling and litter from discarded flower wrappings in the churchyard. *See separate item.*

**Please note Chedington's Annual Village meeting was held on 16<sup>th</sup> May and matters arising will be reported to the next meeting of the Parish Council.**

- ❖ **DAPTC (Dorset Association of Parish & Town Councils) Annual Conference** – This year's theme was "Self-reliance". In future Town and Parish Councils will need to recruit volunteers to get non-essential work done such as hedge cutting, repair of fingerposts and drain/gully clearance. Councils are being encouraged to share the costs or to establish a pool of volunteers. District Cllr Tony Alford commented that where Town and Parish Councils had already combined forces it had been successful.
- ❖ **Highways Issues:**
  - **Pipplepen Lane** - potholes have been reported for repair. It is on the Highways schedule for surface dressing in the next year.
  - **Junction A3066/Lecher Lane** – Vegetation on the verge is long and obscures oncoming traffic on A3066. (*This has now been cut but is a continuing problem during the growing season and needs to be regularly mown*). There is still an issue with overtaking along this stretch of the A3066, which is potentially hazardous to drivers entering and exiting Lecher Lane.
- ❖ **Footpath Map** – Desmond Thomas, a local artist, has produced an illustrative map of all the footpaths in and around South Perrott and Chedington. Anthony de la Poer has had them printed by Footprintz. These are available from the Clerk for £1 each A4 size and £4 for the larger one.
- ❖ **Mosterton Pre-school** – Mosterton preschool have requested financial help towards funding the new preschool building. They have been invited to speak at the next meeting. (*See separate article*).
